

2015 Annual President's Report January 26th, 2016

This report summarizes the activities of Friends of Barnstable Harbor in 2015.

• Directors & By-Laws:

There were no changes to our Directors & By Laws in 2015.

General Activity:

YEP – Youth Education Project:

As a stewardship organization for Barnstable Harbor, we feel that education is an integral component of ensuring that future generations gain knowledge and interest in maintaining a healthy coastal ecosystem and environment as well as develop a historical perspective with regard to our maritime heritage.

Many children growing up on Cape Cod miss the opportunity to experience the coastal world that is the fundamental difference between seaside and inland communities. With this in mind, we have invited the Town of Barnstable 4th grade classes for an "outdoor classroom experience" with Barnstable Harbor Ecotours.

The Barnstable Harbor Ecotours' boat, the Horseshoe Crab, is a 30' U.S.C.G. certified pontoon boat that comfortably carries up to 26 passengers. Its crew consists of a captain and a mate/naturalist. The Horseshoe Crab is docked in Barnstable Harbor and a typical tour lasts 2 hours.

These trips would subscribe to the Massachusetts Science and Technology/ Engineering Framework standards for 4th Graders. Eco-Tours naturalist Andrea Higgins would provide STEM curriculum plans including pre and post trip materials introducing scientific concepts and other teaching tools to teachers in preparation for the trip.

Environmental Committee:

Cape Cod Commission's Watershed Management Director Tom Cambareri made a presentation to the Environmental Committee on watershed issues that directly impact Barnstable Harbor. Tom noted that Town of Barnstable's "south-side" embayments are more distressed than Barnstable Harbor (our extreme tides keep the water flowing), however, he strongly encouraged us to pursue the MEP water quality study as conditions likely vary across the harbor. Harbor Management Plan:

A Harbor Management Plan (HMP) meeting was held in March. It was agreed that FBH would benefit more from the creation of a "blue print" for Barnstable Harbor than from a state-sanctioned HMP. It was thought that a state sanctioned HPM was complicated, expensive, involved T of B participation, and might jeopardize current historical infrastructure. Nevertheless, such a "blueprint" of Barnstable Harbor would be an important tool for addressing concerns such as use/abuse of recreational and commercial resources, establishing a regularized dredge schedule, planning for sea level rise and accompanying watershed issues, and other impacts on Barnstable Harbor.

Millway Bridge:

We consulted with a local engineer for a second opinion on the condition of the Millway Bridge. This consultation confirmed the MA DOT assessment of the condition of the bridge as being "good".

Boat Basin Changes/Commercial Shell fishermen:

We have been working with the Town of Barnstable Harbormaster's office and the Shellfish Committee to implement changes at the Boat Basin to make the "marina" more attractive for commercial shellfish operations.

Recommendations to the Town:

- -Offer reserved parking for commercial shell fishermen's trucks & trailers on the grassy area west of the boat basin
- -Ensure Blish Point Year-Round Access/ Clear ramp of sand & snow

Charter Boat Slips in Perpetuity:

We are supporting Ann Canedy's proposal to the Town of Barnstable to designate the current charter boat slips be held in perpetuity as charter boat slips. This "charter fleet" represents our maritime economy and is also an important element in the fabric of Barnstable Harbor & Village tourism.
